- Royalty income from Mining Area C iron ore (BHPB), Western Australia








Iluka's Approach

Operations and Assets






- Distribution warehouses located within major markets
- Zircon and titanium dioxide products supplied to more than 40 countries
- Major supplier in emerging and developing markets (China, India, Middle East, South America)

Operations Integration





Jacinth-Ambrosia Operation



- Commissioned in 2009, full production mid 2010
- Fly-in fly-out from Ceduna / Adelaide Village accommodates 160 persons
- ≈ 70 employees and 85 contractors
- Heavy Mineral Concentrate transported 270km by road to Port Thevenard
- Concentrate shipped to Geraldton (WA) or Hamilton (Vic) for final processing
- Pivotal to production and product flexibility
- Uniquely high zircon assemblage







Doing Business in South Australia



State Government

- Supportive of resource development e.g. PACE
 - engaging and consultative regulatory landscape
 - single point responsibility for mining approvals
 - focused on infrastructure facilitation
- Good place to explore:
 - consultative agencies
 - Amalgamated Expenditure Agreements
 - tenement security



People and Services

- Mining technical professionals recruitment and retention challenging
- Industrial relations setting is still evolving
- Local employment at entry level and trades
- Remote site services capacity reflective of industry scale

Doing Business with Local communities



Winner - 2013 SA Premier's Award

- Social development opportunities at the JA operation to the Far West Coast Aboriginal people
- Championing employment (22.7%), Average length of employment of FWC employees 36.5 months
- Education, training and development opportunities and supporting business development
- Driving recruitment and retention through major site contracts

- Supporting labour hire agency for broader regional services






Education/ Scholarship Program

- Currently 6 students on the Scholarship Program




Iluka's SA Regional Contribution





- · Geographically isolated region
- Agriculture based economy
- Mining is relative small employer
- JA is sole mining operation in region



Economic Contribution *

- Iluka directly provided 170 jobs to the region (2,450 jobs in region)
- Direct value add \$55m
- Flow on impacts to Ceduna region 165 jobs
- Flow on value add Ceduna region \$20m
- Flow on impacts to SA of 929 jobs (including non-JA jobs)
- Flow on value add SA \$168 million



Sustainable Development - Rehabilitation



2013

7.54ha reinstated for rehabilitation (Cell 1 East)

- First of Jacinth Pit areas 40% of Pit
- Myall/Mallee woodland unit
- Late 2013 recorded 21 native plant species
- Resident birds (Richards pipit) returning to area

2014

15ha rehab well advanced

- Remainder (60%) of first mining pit
- Expanding 2013 trials
- Includes reinstatement of creek and controlling

- Share research outcomes across the broader community:

 - salinity migration
 - soil management
 - root mapping
 - Bullock bush growth trials
- Sustainability supports growth



Eucla Basin Exploration



- \$4.4m expenditure in SA in 2013
 - ≈ 54% of annual HM exploration budget
- Tenement area >36,000 km²
- Recent Eucla Basin exploration activity:
 - 35,000m of drilling in 2013
 - 90% of drilling on greenfield targets
 - brownfield drilling around Atacama
- Non-mineral sands exploration 2014










New Projects: Eucla Basin Satellite Deposits



- Atacama, Typhoon and Sonoron
- Chloride ilmenite deposits with associated zircon
- Ilmenite suitable as a synthetic rutile feed
- Close proximity to Jacinth-Ambrosia infrastructure
- Potential mine life extension to ~2027+
- Pre feasibility study stage
- Options for expansion and concurrent mining
